Many prospective students are interested in attending Mississippi Delta Community College (MDCC) because of some exclusive programs and services the institution has to offer.

One program for which MDCC is especially well known is the Law Enforcement Training Academy. MDCC is the only community college in the state to have a comprehensive academy for law officers. In an effort to produce more efficient, well-trained and safety-conscious officers, this academy gives cadets a 10-week training session, which includes physical fitness examinations and firearms certification. Classroom training is also a part of this course and focuses on such areas as police ethics, crime prevention, cultural awareness, report writing, courtroom procedures and more. Advanced training is also available in addition to the 10-week session and involves handling confidential informants, tactical communications, hate crimes, search and seizure and interview and interrogation.

In the student activity arena, the Ambassadors show choir has attracted the attention of prospective students looking to continue their high school music career on the college level. Students come from all over Mississippi to enroll at MDCC specifically to be a part of this high-energy group, which also serves the college in public relations and recruiting. Young people are selected for MDCC's Ambassadors on the basis of talent, academic success, leadership, work ethic and attitude, with all members receiving full college scholarships.

The MDCC district enrolls approximately 3,400 students each semester at the main campus in Moorhead, Greenwood Center, Charles W. Capps Jr. Technology Center in Indianola and the Greenville Higher Education Center. While the Capps Technology Center offers a complete program in workforce training, the remaining three sites are comprehensive in that they provide degree and certificate options in academic transfer, technical and career programs.
