Located in Cleveland, Delta State University is the cultural and educational heartbeat of the Mississippi Delta's 20-county region. More than 4,000 students participate in the 12 baccalaureate degree programs in 38 majors and nine master's degree programs. Established as a teacher's college in 1924, the school is well known for its educational specialist and doctor of education degree programs.

Delta State offers a wide range of majors to meet any aspiration. The university also offers many unique programs and is the home of the Delta Music Institute.

The Delta Music Institute (DMI) is an independent center under the College of Arts & Sciences. Its mission is to provide students with a broad and thorough education in the music and entertainment industries. The DMI houses two world-class recording studios. The program offers a concentration of music and entertainment industry courses leading to a bachelor of science in interdisciplinary studies degree or a bachelor of arts in music degree with an emphasis in music production. Whether producing their own art or the art of others, DMI alumni will be well prepared for the technical, business and legal issues that confront the practicing artist today and in the future.

National Championship. The football team won the Division II national title in 2000, and the cheerleading program has won six national championships.

All total, Delta State has 13 intercollegiate sports including soccer, cross country, softball, basketball and offers the only collegiate Olympic swimming and diving team in the state.
