Mississippi College is not only Mississippi's oldest college, but it is also the state's largest private university. The Christian college offers a large campus with a small student-to-teacher ratio, and continues to draw students looking for the best college experience possible.

Founded in 1826, the Clinton-based four-year college is home to thousands of students from all over the state, nation and world. Most students live on campus, and all take advantage of MC's excellent academic programs and small classrooms that creates a lot of personal, one-on-one attention.

The first co-ed college in the United States to grant degrees to women, Mississippi College is located on 320 landscaped acres in the heart of Clinton, a fast-growing community with small town charm. *U.S. News and World Report* magazine has ranked the college as a "Best Value" school.

"Our mission remains constant as we seek to provide the best in academic programs, but we know our distinction does not rest only in our academic reputation," said Lee Royce, president of Mississippi College. "We're a university committed to Christian higher education in the pursuit of Christian truth and in service to the world."

Mississippi College, affiliated with the Mississippi Baptist Convention, offers more than 80 areas of study leading to bachelor's degrees, more than two dozen master's degree programs and a law school located in the heart of downtown Jackson (the Mississippi College School of Law continues to grow, with current enrollment of more than 500 students from 29 different states). The college's new engineering/physics program launched just last year, and MC is home to the state's first master's degree program in dyslexia therapy, one of only five colleges in the United States to offer such a program.

One example of Mississippi College faculty preparing their students well — over the last few years three out of four pre-med students have been accepted to medical school.

Study abroad options are popular, with past trips carrying participants to the United Kingdom, Spain, Germany, just to name a few.
